


A “Snapshot” of History - Lee in 1766

In 1766, 250 years ago this year, Lee became incorporated as a NH township. 1766 was also the 8th year of the French & Indian War, which would rage on for yet another year before the British and their allied Indian tribes (Mohawk, etc.) defeated the French and their allied tribes (Abenaki, etc.) - and gained control of the vast French held territory in North America. In 1766, American colonists - like the militia men of Lee - still considered themselves British citizens and fought alongside the British to win victory against the French.

It wouldn't be until shortly after the end of the French & Indian War in 1767 that the British colonists in America finally began to realize that not only had their loyalty to Great Britain during the war not won them full representation in Parliament, but that all efforts at diplomacy between the American Colonies and the British government continued to fail. By 1775, when Lee had only been an incorporated NH town for 9 years, the American colonists found themselves in a full-scale rebellion against their mother country. But that's a story for another day...

- The caller advising that he is from Microsoft and wants to help you with a virus that is on your computer.
- The caller advising that he is from the IRS and you need to pay your back taxes.
- The caller advising that he is your grandchild and is in trouble in a different country and needs money wired to him.
- The caller, or a pop up message on your computer, advising that he is from the FBI and your computer contains child pornography, to unlock your computer you must pay a "fine".
- The caller advising that you missed a jury duty date and unless you pay a "fine" you will be arrested.
- The caller advising that you have won a lottery and you need to pay the taxes up front.






Adult Book Discussion


